
The Mission of the Nobel Peace Laureate Project is to encourage young people to explore, model and promote peace in their lives, their community and their world.

ALFRED B. NOBEL AND THE NOBEL PRIZE

Alfred Bernhard Nobel (1833-1896), a Swedish industrialist, engineer and chemist, experimented with ways to stabilize highly volatile materials used in explosives to make them safer. By 1867, Nobel had invented and patented dynamite. He set up factories around the world and made an enormous fortune.

In his will, Nobel established namesake prizes in physics, chemistry, medicine, literature and peace to reward human ingenuity. These prizes are recognized internationally as the most prestigious professional honor an individual or organization can receive. The recipient (known as a Laureate) is selected by a five-member committee appointed by the Parliament of Norway and receives a medal, certificate, diploma and monetary gift.

The **Nobel Peace Laureate Project** is a grass roots organization in Eugene, Oregon, with the goals of "inspiring future peacemakers" by recognizing the American winners of the Nobel Peace Prize and increasing the knowledge Americans have of their own internationally recognized peacemakers. Constructed in 2012, the NOBEL PEACE PARK is the only park in the United States that honors the American Nobel Laureates.

The Nobel Peace Laureate Project Scholarship is open to graduating high school seniors who have enrolling in a post-secondary educational institution and who have demonstrated through activities, scholarship or artistic endeavors interest in and dedication to peace.

Checklist for the Nobel Peace Laureate Project Scholarship Application

1. Application Cover Form
2. Transcripts
High School Seniors: Enclose a seventh semester high school transcript showing grade point average (if available)
3. Letters of recommendation: Please submit two letters of recommendation from those who know you. A suggestion is one academic reference and one community reference
4. Please include a one-page statement about yourself and your understanding of “peace.”
5. Send us the name of the post-secondary educational institution that you will attend. Include the address of the Financial Aid Office, city, state and zip code.

Directions for Award Applicants

Part 1

1. Please write a one-page (250 words letter) to the Nobel Peace Laureate Board of Directors about yourself and your understanding of peace.

In your one-page letter, consider three constants in your life that resonate with peace.

- First: the principles that guide your actions and thoughts for peace.
 - Second: the vision that shapes your thought into action for peace.
 - Third: individual action(s) you have taken to promote peace in your community and/or beyond.
2. Include a copy of your school transcript with your letter.
 3. Deadline for submitting your application is **May 31, 2023 (Postmark by)**

Part 2

1. Please ask two adults (not related to you) who know you well to write 150 - 250 words on the recommendation form about you and why they think you should be considered for this scholarship. One recommendation could be from a teacher, the other from a community member, for instance. Give each a copy of the Scholarship Recommendation form.
